AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO ORDINANCE NO. 72

SECTION 4. d) The city clerk shall collect an annual registration fee for each dog as set forth in Section 13, except those excluded from registration fees as outlined in Section 4(f).

SECTION 4 f) Exclusions from registration fee requirements. Individuals may obtain a waiver from registration fees if they operate any of the following: certified dog kennel, boarding care facility for dogs, licensed commercial dog training, or a certified verterinary facility. An application form for said waiver must be completed and file with the city clerk and approved by Council on an annual basis. Any person issued a waiver must report all dogs in their care to the city clerk. Any dogs not used for commercial purposes that are owned by the individual issued a waiver are subject to registration fee requirements.

This ordinance shall take efffect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication in the official city newspaper as provided by law.

RESOLUTION TO ORDINANCE 72, 200 RELATING TO THE KEEPING OF ROTWEILLER DOGS ALREADY WITHIN THE CITY OF BRONSON, KANSAS ON OR BEFORE MAY 6, 2002

REQUIREMENTS. ROTTWEILER DOGS SHALL ONLY BE KEPT AND ALLOWED WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS, UPON THE FOLLOWING STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS.

- (a) <u>Leash and Muzzle-</u> No person shall permit a rottweiler dog to go outside it's kennel or pen unless such dog is securely leashed with a leash no longer that four feet in length. No person shall permit a rottweiler to be kept on a chain, rope or other type of leash outside it's kennel or pen unless a person is in physical control of the leash. Such dogs may not be leashed to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, buildings, etc.
- (b) <u>Confinement</u>- All rottweiler dogs shall be securely confined indoors or in a securely enclosed and locked pen or kennel, except when leashed and muzzled as above provided. Such pen, kennel or structure must have secure and sides and a secure top attached to the sides. All structures used to confine rottweiler dogs must be locked with a key or combination lock when the animals are within the structure. Such structure must have a secure bottom or floor attached to the sides of the pen or the sides of the pen must be embedded in the ground no less than two feet. All structures erected to house rottweiler dogs must comply with all zoning and building regulations of the city. All structures must be adequately lighted and ventilated and kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (c) <u>Confinement Indoors</u>-No rottweiler dog may be kept on a porch, patio or in any part of a house or structure that would allow the dog to exit the building on it's own volition. In addition, no animal may be kept in a house or structure when the windows are open or when screen windows or screen doors are the only obstacle preventing the dog from exiting the structure.

PENALTIES. Any person violating or permitting the violation of any provision, shall upon conviction in municipal court, be fined a sum no less than \$200 and not more than \$1,000. In addition to the fine imposed, the court may sentence the defendant to imprisonment in the county jail for a period of time not to exceed 60 days. In addition, the court shall order the license of the subject rottweiler revoked and the dog removed from the city. Should the defendant refuse to remove the dog from the city, the municipal court judge may find the defendant owner in contempt and order the immediate confiscation and impoundment of the animal. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense. In addition to the foregoing penalties, any person who violates these sections shall pay all expenses, including shelter, food, handling, veterinary care, witness fees and court costs necessitated by the enforcement.
